VACCINES RECOMMENDED FOR ALL CAT LIFESTYLES:

RABIES

Under Indiana state law, dogs and cats older than 3 months must be vaccinated against the rabies virus. Rabies attacks the nervous system and can be fatal to both people and pets alike.

FVRCP (DISTEMPER)

This core vaccine protects against three potentially deadly airborne viruses: rhinotracheitis (herpes), calicivirus, and panleukopenia (distemper).

DOES YOUR CAT:



- venture outside at all
- hang out on a screened in porch
- meet neighborhood cats
- visit a groomer or boarding kennel
- occasionally escape the house

DO YOU:

- take strays into your home
- pet sit other cats in your home
- foster cats in your home

If you answered "yes" to any of the above questions, we recommend any and all cats in your household receive the **Feline Leukemia vaccination (FeLV)**.

FeLV is the most common cause of cancer in cats and can lead to blood disorders and immune deficiencies. FeLV is usually fatal, with 80-90% of infected cats passing within 3-5 years of initial diagnosis. Cats that are infected have a weakened immune system, which can lead to additional diseases associated with FeLV.
